Chanak Affair (1922)

- We didn't want to send troops to Turkey to support Britain
- William Lyon Mackenzie King's decision
- Canada getting an independent voice

**Halibut Treaty (1923)**

- Canada and USA agreement
- Canada didn't let Britain get involved
- Fishing rights
- 1st treaty that Canada negotiated in dependently

**Balfour Report (1926)**

- Report/recommendation
- All colonies of Britain (Canada was a colony) are considered equal to independence

**Statute of Westminster (1926)**

- Legal independence from Britain
- End result in the gradual freedom for Canada
